General Information

Why is qualification necessary?

Interschools is a State Championship event. Therefore, to compete safely and competitively, riders must be able to demonstrate that a horse/rider combination they have the skill and ability to undertake the events in which they propose to enter.

Divisions

Primary competition – restricted to riders enrolled up to and including year 6 in the year of competition.

Secondary competition – restricted to riders enrolled in year 7 to 12 in the year of competition.

Secondary is then broken down further to:

Intermediate competition – restricted to riders enrolled in year 7, 8 and 9 in the year of competition.

Senior competition – restricted to riders enrolled in year 10, 11 and 12 in the year of competition.

All entries must:

1. Be completed by the parent or guardian of the entrant.
2. Be financial, competitive, junior members of Equestrian WA to enter the Championship classes.
3. Be financial, minimum participant, junior member of Equestrian WA to enter the Participant classes.
4. Competitive junior riders entering the Championship classes must have their horse/pony microchipped and hold a full registration with Equestrian WA.
5. Be completed via Nominate.
6. Be completed and paid for by the closing date – no late entries.
7. Comply with qualification requirements for the classes you are entering.

How many events can I enter?

As per the EA discipline rules, we allow:

- ✓ A maximum of two horses per discipline per rider.
- ✓ A horse to compete in no more than three efforts per day.
 - An effort is:
 - One dressage test
 - One jumping round height
 - One show horse division
 - One combined training height
- ✓ Horses must be aged four years or older at the time of entry.

Discipline Classes and Qualifications

COMBINED TRAINING

- Only one (1) CT class can be entered per combination.
- Each entry is for one dressage test and one round of jumping by the same horse and rider combination.
- Classes will be capped and allocated on a first come, first served basis with valid qualifications.
- All classes will be run under EA Eventing Rules
- No callers and no whips to be used for dressage phase.
- Qualifications are required.

DRESSAGE

- Maximum of two consecutive classes.
- Each class entry is for two tests for the same horse and rider combination.
- No callers for riders entering championship classes.
- Qualifications are required for championship classes.

JUMPING

- Rider/horse combinations can enter two consecutive height classes only.
- Championship consists of three jumping competitions over three days.
- Participant class consists of two jumping competitions over two days.
- Qualifications are required for championship classes.

SHOW HORSE

- Show Horse and Show Hunter classes are three (3) phases.
- Working Hunter is four (4) phases.
- Rider/horse combinations may compete in one (1) class only.
- Riders may enter more than one horse; however, each horse can only be ridden by one the rider.
- Dependent upon number of entrants riders on multiple horses in the same class may have a short time between rides or may need to choose one horse over the other if the OC cannot accommodate timing.
