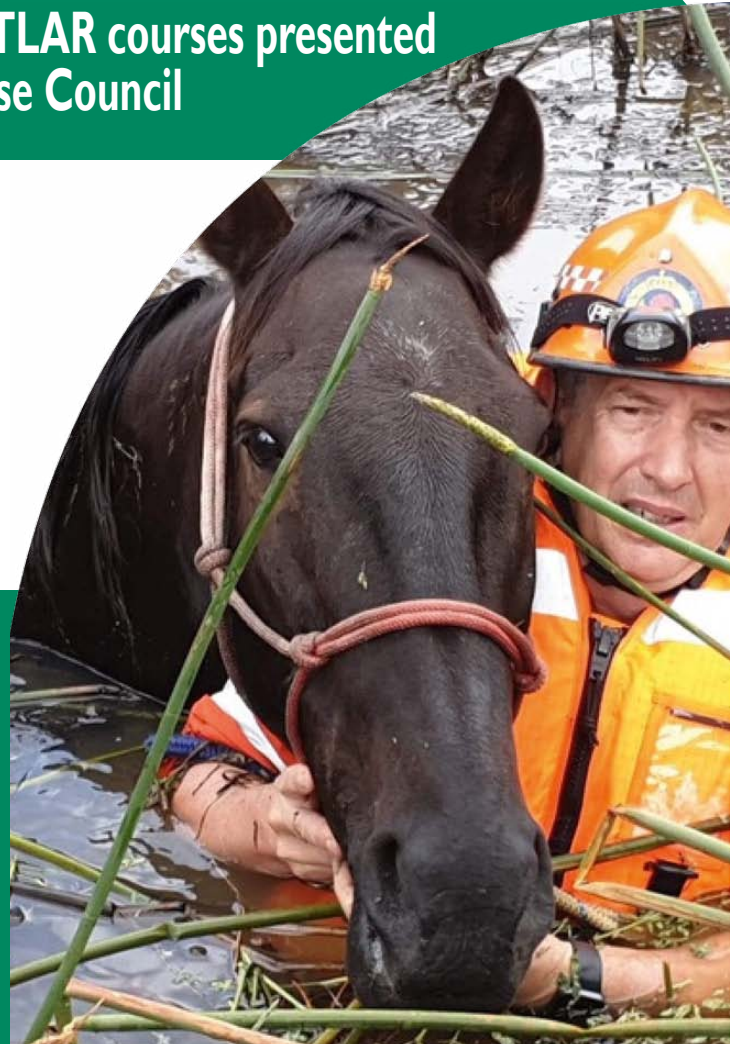
David King will join the WA Horse Council at the State Equestrian Centre, Brigadoon, in conducting one-day, responder training courses in large animal transport emergency rescue.

David is a former NSW State Emergency Service (NSW SES) Hawkesbury Unit Deputy Commander and the Co-chair of the NSW SES General Land Rescue Capability Development Group.

With more than 30 years of experience rescuing horses and cattle from creeks, dams, floats, buildings and bogs, David is now actively training rescue agencies throughout Australasia in all aspects of large animal rescue and relocation.

Author of numerous NSW SES training resources including road crash rescue, industrial and domestic rescue, flood rescue and more recently large animal rescue.

David was central to the development of the Large Animal Rescue Operations Guidelines for the Australian Fire Authority Council (AFAC) and is on the board of the Australian Emergency Incident Management Network-AEIMN (AUS/NZ).



The course includes:

- Risks of working in close proximity to large animals inside a horse float
- Role of the veterinarian
- Options for rescuing or relocating an animal from a transport incident
- Complex rescue operations
- Rescuing a cast horse from a float (practical, including roll overs of the simulated teaching float)
- Righting an overturned float.
